Historic Gainesville, FL Walk

DATE: November 4, 2017, Sanction #108792

LOCATION: The Thomas Center, 306 NE 6th Ave., Gainesville, FL 32601

START TIME: Register at 1:00 p.m. The walk will begin promptly at 1:30 p.m.

DISTANCES: 5 and 10 Km

TRAIL RATING: 1A

AVA Special Prog: National Register of Historic Places, Make a Wish at a Water Fountain, You'll Never Walk Alone, Points of Reference

DESCRIPTION: The Northeast Historic District was entered into the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. The district is significant for the concentration and evolution of an early residential neighborhood. The 290 historic buildings reflect the architectural styles prevalent in Florida during the 1880's through the 1920's and the public green spaces depict the development of Gainesville between these years. The walk also goes through the Southeast Historic District which contains a large number of historic buildings from the same period.
